OPENING SENTENCES: John 13:34

CONFESSION and ABSOLUTION

On this holy night, as we remember Christ's journey to the cross for us, let us confess our sins to God our Father, and ask Him to forgive us through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Be merciful to me, O God, because of Your constant love. Because of Your great mercy wipe away my sins! Wash away all my evil and make me clean from my sin! I recognise my faults; I am always conscious of my sins. I have sinned against You - only against You and done what You consider evil. So You are right in judging me; You are justified in condemning me. I have been evil from the day I was born; from the time I was conceived, I have been sinful. Sincerity and truth are what You require; fill my mind with Your wisdom. Remove my sin, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow. Let me hear the sounds of joy and gladness; and though You have crushed me and broken me, I will be happy once again. Close Your eyes to my sins and wipe out all my evil.

> Glory to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

What can I offer to the LORD for all His goodness to me? I will lift up the cup of salvation, and call on the name of the LORD. I will offer you a sacrifice of thanksgiving, and call on the name of the LORD. I will keep my promises to the LORD in the presence of all His people; in the courts of the house of the LORD, in your midst, O Jerusalem.

PRAYER TIME

Jesus our Saviour, at His last meal with His disciples gave them and us that new commandment: "Love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another." In the knowledge of Christ's love for us, and His call to love one another, we pray for the world, the church, and all in need.

Heavenly Father,

on this holy night, we remember the Passover of Your ancient people, fulfilled in Your Son's gift of the New Testament in His blood. Be gracious to us and bless us. Remember not our sins and transgressions, but forgive us and create in us new and contrite hearts. Lord, in Your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Holy God, source of all love,

Jesus gave His disciples a new commandment: To love one another as He loved them. By Your Holy Spirit, write this commandment in our hearts.

Help us serve as Jesus served, to be unafraid to offer ourselves for the sake of others. Lord, in Your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Lord, we pray for our families and friends and for the communities in which we live and work. Help us also to look outwards and to care for those who are on the fringes of our society. Lord, in Your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Lord, we pray Your peace for the nations and our own nation. Send Your Spirit into leaders and rulers. Give them wisdom and a vision of Your will for all people. Lord, in Your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

> Lord, we pray for all who are suffering today and carrying the burdens of sickness, grief, anxiety or guilt. Grant strength and hope to all affected by the coronavirus COVID-19. Lord, in Your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Lord, we pray for churches throughout the world who celebrate the mystery of Your Son's Passover, and those Christians who are unable to gather together.

Where there is distress, bring consolation; where there is strife, bring forgiveness; where there is suffering, bring help; and where there is persecution, bring freedom and joy.

Lord, in Your mercy, hear our prayer.

Lord God, loving Father, You know what we need, and You have promised never to abandon us. Help us to endure in faith, and with a joyful hearts, receive the blessings of Your grace and the answers to our prayers; through Jesus Christ, our Lord,

who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

LORD'S PRAYER

After the Prayers, pray aloud

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name, Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are Yours now and forever. Amen.

BLESSING AND DISMISSAL

Say aloud: The almighty and merciful Lord, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, bless and keep us.

Amen.

STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR

One of the customs of the Church at this time is the 'Stripping of the Altar'.

Originally the stripping was done on Maundy Thursday in order that the Cloths and the Altar might receive their once-a-year wash in preparation for Easter.

The Stripping of the Altar table is seen as a symbol of the way in which Christ was stripped of His clothing and His dignity before His crucifixion. The rite points ahead to the second day of the Three Days to Easter celebration, Good Friday.
