THE CANDLES OF ADVENT THE THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT: JOY

Today is the third Sunday of Advent. The third candle of Advent is the Candle of Joy. It reminds of the joy that Mary felt when the angel Gabriel told her that a special child would be born to her - a child who would save and deliver His people.

God wants us all to have joy. The angel who announced to the shepherds that Jesus had been born told them: "Do not be afraid. I am bringing you good news of a great joy for all people - for to you is born this day, in the City of David, a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord."

Let us pray:

Loving God, we thank You for the joy you bring us. Help us prepare our hearts for this gift. Bless our worship. May Your joy radiate in our lives that those around us may find warmth in your joy, now and forever. We ask this in the name of the one born in Bethlehem. Amen.

The King of Israel, the LORD, is in your midst; you will see evil no more. ¹⁶ On that day it will be said to Jerusalem: Fear not, O Zion; let not your hands be slack. ¹⁷ The LORD your God is in your midst, a Mighty One, who will save. GOSPEL: Luke 3:7-18 The preaching of John the Baptiser.

Before the reading Glory be to You, O LORD.

⁷ When the crowds came to John for baptism, he said, "You brood of snakes! Who warned you to flee God's coming wrath? 8 Prove by the way you live that you have repented of your sins and turned to God. Don't just say to each other, 'We're safe, for we are descendants of Abraham.' That means nothing, for I tell you, God can create children of Abraham from these very stones. ⁹ Even now the axe of God's judgment is poised, ready to sever the roots of the trees. Yes, every tree that does not produce good fruit will be chopped down and thrown into the fire." ¹⁰ The crowds asked, "What should we do?" 11 John replied, "If you have two shirts, give one to the poor. If you have food, share it with those who are hungry." 12 Even corrupt tax collectors came to be baptised and asked, "Teacher, what should we do?" ¹³He replied, "Collect no more taxes than the government requires." 14 "What should we do?" asked some soldiers. John replied, "Don't extort money or make false accusations. And be content with your pay." ¹⁵ Everyone was expecting the Messiah to come soon, and they were eager to know whether John might be the Messiah. 16 John answered their questions by saying, "I baptise you with water; but someone is coming soon who is greater than I am—so much greater that I'm not even worthy to be His slave and untie the straps of His sandals. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. ¹⁷ He is ready to separate the chaff from the wheat with His winnowing fork. Then He will clean up the threshing area, gathering the wheat into His barn but burning the chaff with never-ending fire." 18 John used many such warnings as he announced the Good News to the people.
