BIBLE READING

FIRST READING: Isaiah 43:16-21 God promises a new deliverance for His people¹⁶ This is what the LORD says — who makes a way through the sea, a path through the mighty waters, ¹⁷ who brings out chariots and horsemen, and armies and warriors at the same time. They lay there, never to rise again, extinguished, snuffed out like a candle: ¹⁸ "Don't remember the former things; don't dwell on things past. ¹⁹ Watch! I'm about to carry out something new! And now it's springing up— don't you recognise it? I'm making a way in the wilderness and paths in the desert. ²⁰ Wild animals, jackals, and owls will honour Me because I provide water in the desert and streams in the wilderness to give drink to My people, My chosen ones, ²¹ the people whom I formed for Myself and so that they may speak My praise."

SECOND READING: Philippians 3:4b-14 Already righteous but not yet perfect

^{4b} Indeed, if others have reason for confidence in the flesh, I have even more! ⁵I was circumcised when I was eight days old. I am a pure-blooded citizen of Israel and a member of

the tribe of Benjamin-a real Hebrew if there ever was one! I was a member of the Pharisees, who demand the strictest obedience to the Jewish law. ⁶I was so zealous that I harshly persecuted the church. And as for righteousness, I obeyed the law without fault. ⁷I once thought these things were valuable, but now I consider them worthless because of what Christ has done. ⁸Yes, everything else is worthless when compared with the infinite value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For His sake I have discarded everything else, counting it all as garbage, so that I could gain Christ ⁹ and become one with Him. I no longer count on my own righteousness through obeying the law; rather, I become righteous through faith in Christ. For God's way of making us right with Himself depends on faith. ¹⁰ I want to know Christ and experience the mighty power that raised Him from the dead. I want to suffer with Him, sharing in His death, ¹¹ so that one way or another I will experience the resurrection from the dead! ¹² I don't mean to say that I have already achieved these things or that I have already reached perfection. But I press on to possess that perfection for which Christ Jesus first possessed me. ¹³ No, dear brothers and sisters, I have not achieved it, but I focus on this one thing: Forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead, ¹⁴ I press on to reach the end of the race and receive the heavenly prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us.

GOSPEL: John 12:1-8 Mary anoints Jesus at Bethany

Before the reading Glory be to You, O LORD.

¹ Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus lived, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. ² Here a dinner was given in Jesus' honour. Martha served, while Lazarus was among those reclining at the table with Him. ³ Then Mary took about half a litre of pure nard, an expensive perfume; she poured it on Jesus' feet and wiped His feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. ⁴ But one of His disciples, Judas Iscariot, who was later to betray Him, objected, ⁵ 'Why wasn't this perfume sold and the money given to the poor? It was worth a year's wages.' ⁶ He did not say this because he cared about the poor but because he was a thief; as keeper of the money bag, he used to help himself to what was put into it. ⁷ 'Leave her alone,' Jesus replied. 'It was intended that she should save this perfume for the day of My burial. ⁸ You will always have the poor among you, but you will not always have Me.'
