LIGHTING OF THE PASCHAL CANDLE

On the day we celebrate Christ's great victory over the darkness of sin and death. His new life is our new life, and his resurrection is our resurrection. To symbolise the new beginning we have in him, we light our Paschal candle.

(The Paschal candle is lit)

Christ our light: We thank you. Christ our light: We adore you.

Christ our light: In faith we follow you. Shine upon us now and always. Amen.

CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION

Christ died and rose so that we could have God's forgiveness and receive new life as God's forever people. Let us embrace that new life by confessing our sins and receiving the grace God offers on account of the cross.

Father in heaven, your Son gave his life on the cross to redeem sinners. We confess this morning that we are just that. So often we have closed our hearts to your will. So often we have closed our ears to your Word. So often we have closed ourselves off from others, refusing to love them as you love us. Please forgive us for Jesus' sake. Roll away the stone that cuts us off from you and others. (Pause for personal reflection.)

Lord God,

thank you that has Jesus died for our sake and that his tomb is now open! Thank you for the grace and new life we have through him. Open us up to love and serve others with resurrection faith, joy and hope. Amen.

This is our Easter joy – Christ, who was crucified, has risen. He has defeated death and overcome sin for us. Everyone who trusts in Jesus Christ receives forgiveness of sins through his name. As a called and ordained servant of God's Word, I declare to you: as you have repented, so you are indeed forgiven. ALLELUIA! **AMEN.**

I invite you to exchange a sign of God's peace with one another using these traditional words that have been spoken by Easter Christians throughout the centuries: *He is risen indeed! Alleluia!*

BIBLE READING

FIRST READING: Acts 10:34-43 Summary of Jesus' life and ministry

³⁴Then Peter began to speak: 'I now realise how true it is that God does not show favouritism ³⁵ but accepts from every nation the one who fears him and does what is right. ³⁶ You know the message God sent to the people of Israel, announcing the good news of peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all. ³⁷ You know what has happened throughout the province of Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached – ³⁸ how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power, and how he went around doing good and healing all who were under the power of the devil, because God was with him. ³⁹ 'We are witnesses of everything he did in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They killed him by hanging him on a cross, ⁴⁰ but God raised him from the dead on the third day and caused him to be seen. ⁴¹ He was not seen by all the people, but by witnesses whom God had already chosen – by us who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. ⁴² He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one whom God appointed as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³ All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 The good news of Christ's resurrection

15 Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. ² By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. ³ For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, ⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, ⁵ and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to

the Twelve. ⁶ After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. ⁷ Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, ⁸ and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born. ⁹ For I am the least of the apostles and do not even deserve to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. ¹⁰ But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me was not without effect. No, I worked harder than all of them – yet not I, but the grace of God that was with me. ¹¹ Whether, then, it is I or they, this is what we preach, and this is what you believed.

GOSPEL: Mark 16:1-8 Christ has risen!

Before the reading Glory be to You, O LORD.

16 When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. ² Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb ³ and they asked each other, 'Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?' ⁴ But when they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had been rolled away. ⁵ As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed. ⁶ 'Don't be alarmed,' he said. 'You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. ⁷ But go, tell his disciples and Peter, "He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you."' ⁸ Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid.

STATEMENT OF RESURRECTION FAITH

This is the gospel which we have received, in which we stand, and by which we are saved, if we hold it fast: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day, and that he appeared first to the women, then to Peter and to the Twelve, and then to many faithful witnesses. We believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God. He is the first and the last, the beginning and the end. He is our Lord and our God. Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again. Death no longer has no power over him. The death that he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So let us also consider ourselves dead to sin, and alive to God in Christ Jesus. Christ is risen!
